

The Great Fire of Exeter

On the 28th of October a fire started in an art gallery, and within mere hours had evolved into a monstrous flame, swallowing the famous Royal Clarence hotel. We managed to interview a fireman who was at the scene of the destruction.



Q: What time did you get the call to go to the Royal Clarence?

A: Approximately 5:10.

Q: Where you worried on your way, or did you stay calm?

A: No, for me personally I turn my mind to the jobs; emotion stays at home – training and experience help with this.

Q: How long were you there for?

A: Myself I spent 5-6 days at the incident only with a few short breaks between shifts.

Q: Describe the scene of the fire in three words.

A: Inferno, catastrophic, fierce.

Q: How important is it to stay safe around a fire?

A: Very, no-one should play with fire, fire can be devastating.

Q: Have you learnt anything from the experience?

A: Yes, much has been learnt, examples like how we respond to incidents of heritage buildings and what resources we would use are the two main learning outcomes.

Q: How did you put out the fire?

A: A lot of hard work and hose reels. The main tools were the H Ariel appliances applying water from above.

Q: were you injured whilst putting out the fire?

A: No, luckily not. Many fire fighters were tired and fatigued though.
